TO THE 2008 NATIONAL FARM MACHINERY SHOW

The Kentucky State Fair Board proudly welcomes you to the **43rd annual National Farm Machinery Show (NFMS)** — the largest indoor farm show in America. This massive show features thousands of widely recognized agricultural products and services showcased by more than 800 exhibitors in 1.2 million square feet of interconnected exhibit space. Whether searching for heavy machinery, hand tools or computer software, visitors will find the products and services they need, the name brands they trust and the individual assistance from industry experts they want as they browse through more than 27 acres of indoor exhibit space at the Kentucky Exposition Center (KEC).

With the recent completion of the North Wing (formerly East Wing) of the KEC, the show now has even more room to provide the most complete selection of agricultural products and services found under a single roof. Many exhibitors, who were moved from the East Wing to South Wing C during the two-year construction period, will be relocated to the 216,000-square-foot class "A" North Wing. This will allow dozens of additional exhibitors to fill South Wing C, giving NFMS attendees an even greater selection of the products and services needed to operate any agribusiness.

Just through the North Wing, visitors will find the East Hall's expanded **Family Living Center**. Offering 60% more exhibitors than last year's center, this unique area provides show attendees a break from the exhibit halls with its wide selection of handmade jewelry, clothing, crafts, antiques and collectibles.

Action-packed evenings fill the schedule after the exhibits and Family Living Center close, as the **40th Championship Tractor Pull**, sponsored by Syngenta, roars into Freedom Hall. Each night and again on Saturday afternoon, the oldest indoor tractor pull in the country hosts the top drivers from the U.S. and Canada for some head-to-head competition. This invitation-only pull offers some drivers a share of more than \$200,000 in prize money and the nationally recognized title of Grand Champion. A limited number of tickets for some of the pulls are on sale at the Freedom Hall Ticket Office, located on the east side of Freedom Hall.

We would like to thank all attendees, exhibitors, dealers, manufacturers, sponsors and staff members for their continued support of the National Farm Machinery Show. Through their dedication, the NFMS continues to be the premiere farm show in the country.
